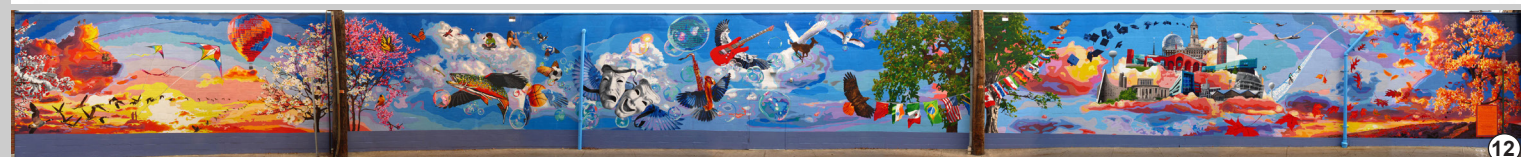

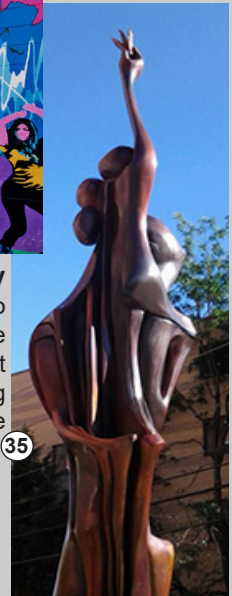

**The Centennial Fountain • 241 S. Fraser Street**  
Unknown Artist | Iron Fountain | 1907 (reconstructed in 1996)

In 1907, The Women's Club gave the Borough of State College an iron drinking fountain for the corner of Pugh Street and College Avenue to celebrate the establishment of State College as a Borough. The cost was \$152.60. It was described by a Woman's Club historian as "an artistic fountain." It accommodated people at the top, horses in the middle, and pigs at the bottom.
